

Purpose of this Session

- Link evaluation criteria to your teaching goals.
 Expand the range of possible assessment options.
 Challenge assumptions about which evaluation methods work or do not work.
- □ Consider presenting alternative assessment methodologies in a way that does not make student anxiety worse but still challenges students to go beyond their normal way of thinking; try to push them beyond their 'comfort zones'.





Summative and formative

Formative assessment: refers to assessment methods that encourage learning during a course


Summative assessment: evaluates student learning at the end of a course; by a written exam, oral exam, final essay etc.

Importance of Communicating Evaluation Methods

- Early and detailed communication of evaluation methods reduces student stress
- Explain in advance the difference between various levels of assessment, how students can excel in the course, and your expectations
- Explain how you go about marking diverse assessment options
- □ Make room for providing detailed feedback
