IUCN ACADEMY OF ENVIRONMENTAL LAW (IUCNAEL)

- A unique global network of university law schools and specialist research centres dedicated to teaching and/or research in the field of environmental law
- The Academy was established in 2003 through the IUCN Environmental Law Commission and its first meeting (Colloquium) was held in Shanghai in November 2003

THE ACADEMY & IUCN

- The Academy is independent of IUCN but uses the name of IUCN under a license agreement
- It works collaboratively with the IUCN Environmental Law Centre (located in Bonn – Director, Dr. Alejandro Iza) and the IUCN World Commission on Environmental Law (chaired by Justice Antonio Benjamin)
- The ELC and WCEL have representation on the Academy's Governing Board





THE ACADEMY SECRETARIAT

- The Academy is an incorporated not-for-profit body under U.S. law
- Its first Secretariat was established in the Faculty of Law at the University of Ottawa (Canada) in 2006
- The current Secretariat is located jointly at the University of Maryland Law School and Pace University Law School (since 2016) in the U.S.



GOVERNANCE OF THE ACADEMY

- The Governing Board was first elected in 2008 and has 10 members representing 10 regions of the world (plus representatives of the IUCN WCEL AND ELC)
- Elections are held each year for 3-4 positions on the Board
- The Chair is also elected each year:

2003-2008: Prof Nicholas Robinson (Pace University, USA)2008-2013: Prof Robert Fowler (University of South Australia, Australia)

2013-2016: Prof Nilufer Oral (Istanbul Bilgi University, Turkey) 2016-present: Prof Elizabeth Kirk (Nottingham Trent University, UK)

• Current Board members for Asia: Prof Qin Tianbao (North Asia); Prof Amber Pant (South and West Asia); Prof Liza Osorio (South East Asia)





MEMBERSHIP OF THE ACADEMY

 - Commitment to supporting participation of one or more of its environmental law lecturers in Academy activities

- US\$70 annually (low-income economy countries, including Bangladesh, Cambodia, India, Laos, Myanmar, Nepal, Pakistan, Vietnam and Western China)

ACTIVITIES – TEACHING & CAPACITY BUILDING (Cont'd)

• Training the Teachers (TTT) Project

- Flagship activity of the Academy is its Training the Teachers Project (Basic and Advanced Courses)

- Under development by Academy since 2004, but concept originated with the ADB-funded training program conducted by the Asia-Pacific Centre for Environmental Law (APCEL) at National University of Singapore in 1997 and 1998

- First delivered in China (2011 and 2013)

- Now being pursued in the Asian region with the support of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) – Developing Environmental Law Champions

IUCN WORLD COMMISSION ON ENVIRONMENTAL LAW (WCEL)

- WCEL is one of six specialized Commissions within the IUCN
- It was established in 1960 as the Special Committee on Legislation and Administration
- Became a Commission in 1963, renamed Commission on Environmental Law in 1990 and WCEL in 2013
- Is a network of environmental law and policy experts from all regions of the world who volunteer their knowledge and services to IUCN activities
- Now has over 800 members across 120 countries
- Members serve in their personal capacity, although they might come from governmental or non-governmental organizations, might be active in private law practice, attached to a university or an international organization
