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RAJP Background

- The Royal Academy of Judicial Professions was established by Royal Decree No. NS/RKT/0105/019, dated 21 January 2005, under the control of the Office of the Council of Ministers.
- The Royal Academy of Judicial Professions was transferred to be under the control of the Ministry of Justice by Royal Decree No. NS/RKT/1013/1058, dated 5 February 2013

1. Mission, Structure and Duties of the RAJP

➤ Mission

- Organize a recruitment and selection exams,
- Conduct foundation professional training for newly selected judge, bailiff, notary and court clerk students, and
- Be In charge of basic and further training, as well as provide training to judges, prosecutors, bailiffs, notaries and court clerks who are performing their duties.

➤ Structure

- Royal School of Judges (27-month program)
- Royal School of Bailiffs (24-month program)
- Royal School of Notaries (30-month program)
- Royal School of Court Clerks (12-month program)
- General Secretariat (in charge of administration and finance, as well as reviewing and coordinating work between the four Royal Schools of Professions)

- Roles and responsibilities of the Royal Academy of Judicial Professions
 - Formulate a master plan for the professional training of bailiffs, notaries and court clerks;
 - Develop and approve development action plans in the RAJP;
 - Determine the procedures for the selection of judge, bailiff, notary and clerk students

- Roles and responsibilities of the Royal Academy of Judicial Professions(continued)
 - Communicate and develop international cooperation in professional training of judges, bailiffs, notaries and court clerks;
 - Adopt internal regulations and codes of conduct;
 - Adopt annual budget; and
 - Perform other duties as set by the Ministry of Justice

2. Organizing professional training programmes for judges of the RAJP

A. Basic training (27 months)

- Module 1: "Basic **Study Subjects**" (1 month)
- Module 2 "Joint Skills of Study Subjects" (8 months): In-depth study of civil law and the criminal law (substance and procedure)
- Module 3: "Joint Curriculum" (6 months: 2 months for the prosecution and 4 months for the judiciary)
- Module 4: "Specialized Study Subjects: Seating Judges and Prosecuting Judges" (4 months)
- Module: 5 "Specialized Curriculum" (6 months)
- Module 6: "Final Study Subject: Lecture, Comprehension Tests, Module Exams and Graduation Exam "(4 months)
- Mobile Module: "Lecture"

2. Organizing professional training programmes for judges of the RAJP

B. Further training

- **Perfecting course**: Refers to the training of seating judges, prosecuting judges, court clerks, bailiffs, notaries and other legal professionals and courts who are practicing their profession and are invited to receive further training. (Provision 4-3 of the Internal Regulations of the RAJP).
 - Short-term training courses: training, workshops, conferences
 - Medium-term training courses: Supplementary course on new laws and training of trainers
- **Training course**: : Refers to the training of seating judges, prosecuting judges, court clerks, bailiffs, notaries and other legal professionals and courts who are practicing their profession and are selected to receive training on another new legal and judicial profession different from their original profession (Provision 4-4 of the Internal Regulations of the RAJP).

3. Vision of Commercial Law Training

- ✓ Training requirements on commercial law for law enforcement officers:
 - Commercial Law
 - Rules and Procedures for Resolving Commercial Disputes
- ✓ Training plan:
 - Training of trainers on commercial judges (national and international)
 - A total of 329 judges are currently serving as judges at all levels of tribunals who may receive such training will be able to become commercial judges for the future commercial courts.

3. Vision of Commercial Law Training

✓ Training plan (conti):

- Develop a training plan for 2023-2024 for priority trainees on the topics:
 1. 4 courses on priority commercial law (2-5 days) x 50 participants/course (per year)
 2. 4 courses of Case Management (2-5 days) x 50 participants/course(per year)
 3. 4 courses of Concluding of Decisions in Commercial Cases (2-5 days) x 50 participants/course (per year)
 4. 2 courses on some priority topics related to the expertise of commercial judges, (2-5 days) x 50 participants/course (per year)
 5. Organizing training course for commercial judges (3 to 6 months) and
 6. Compiling teacher's book, textbooks and case study books

3. Vision of Commercial Law Training (Conti)

- Training of 25 trainers of trainees:
 - Organize training courses for commercial judges 4 times per year
 - Consultation workshop on verification of teaching materials (textbooks and case studies) related to commercial skills (Documents prepared by ADB) 4 times per year
 - Technical and pedagogical training for trainers based on teaching materials and case books 4 times per year
- A detailed curriculum will be developed for the training of selected commercial judge students.

3. Vision of Commercial Law Training (Conti)

✓ **Methodology:**

- Develop teaching materials for trainers as well as equip with teaching techniques and pedagogy to the trainers
- Develop textbooks and case studies for trainees and students
- Practice of Mood Court and practical study tour
- Request for support in technical resources and equipment for training from national and international development partners.
