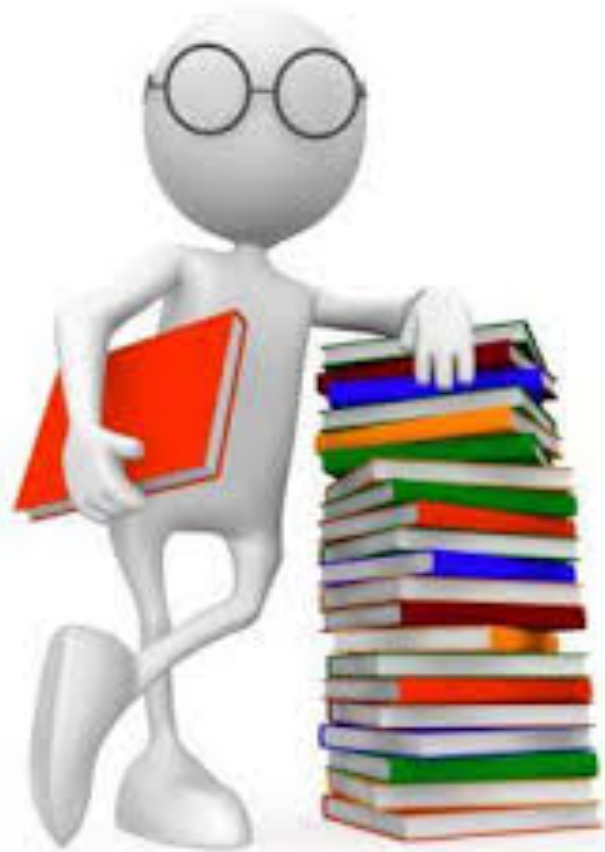
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Course Outline Presentation and Discussion

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About the Course

- ▶ Optional Course - 5th year Law Students
- ▶ Pre-requisites- Understanding of Environment Law
- ▶ Duration- 15 Weeks (3 Credit Course)
- ▶ Course Goals and Objective- Focuses on evolution and development of Climate Change Law and policy including United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change 1992, Paris Agreement and other bilateral treaties.
- ▶ Understanding the impact of Climate Change on human migration and related Laws.



Learning Outcomes

At the end of this course, students will be able;

- ▶ To *identify* the consequences and challenges of Climate Change and Migration.
- ▶ To *understand* the Policy, Law and development of Climate Change and Migration Law at International level.
- ▶ To *analyse* the Laws/Policies related to Climate Change at National and International level.

Course Outline

Course is divided into two parts

- ▶ Part one- Introduction to Climate Change Science and the International legal regime governing Climate Change. Like, the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), The Kyoto Protocol, and The Paris Agreement
- ▶ Part two - Interlinkages between Climate Change induced Migration, Human Rights, and International Law; discussion on the climate change litigation and assessment of environmental damages. Evaluation of India's International commitments and approach to Climate Change.
